SUBJECT: 63,000 GM 2004 Chevrolet Malibu vehicles. Some of these vehicles have an Electronic Control Unit (ECU) that may calculate a higher than actual vehicle speed because of an erratic rear-wheel speed sensor signal, and cause ABS activation where it is not needed or needed ABS activation to be extended during braking as the vehicle speed drops to about 3 mph. GM Recall No. 04030.

Please provide us with a draft owner notification letter for our review before mailing to consumers as well as an estimated owner notification date.
