SUBJECT: 60 Four Winds 2004-2005 Mandalay motor homes do not comply with the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 121, 'Air Brake Systems.' In a situation in which multiple alarms are active, a check engine, stop engine, or similar warning indicator is given priority over the low air alarm by the instrument system controller software. If the operator does not acknowledge these higher priority alarms, a low air alarm may not be displayed.

This is an acknowledgment for this recall. A formal acknowledgment letter will be written only if we have additional comments or concerns.

As stated in your report, Freightliner will be handling the owner notification and remedy for this campaign (04V-283).
