The air bag warning lamp may illuminate due to increased clockspring terminal resistance, or from a backwound condition most likely introduced during vehicle service. DaimlerChrysler Recall No. D17.

This recall was the subject of an Engineering Analysis, EA04-013, conducted by the Office of Defects Investigation.
