SUBJECT: 1,637 Monaco 2002-2004 Holiday Rambler Alumascape, Presidential and McKenzie Lakota and Medallion fifth wheel trailers equipped with liquid propane gas (LPG). It was discovered an excess of LPG hose was coiled in the rear refrigerator access compartment a causing it to be routed close in proximity to the burner flue box cover of the refrigerator. This could potentially cause thermal damage to the LPG line and produce a leak of LPG in the access compartment that could result in an explosion or fire. Monaco Recall No. RO4060
