This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act and is a Follow-Up Notification to an earlier communication sent dated December 3, 2004. Kenworth Truck Company has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in vehicles manufactured from January 2, 2004 through May 12, 2004. Your vehicle has been identified as having been manufactured with this defect and this vehicle has not yet been remedied.

Kenworth Truck Company has determined that some of the huck bolts on this style of cab may not have been properly installed in the area of the left-hand door aperture. If the huck bolts are not properly installed, the cab structure could be compromised and not provide adequate protection for the occupant in an extreme loading condition (i.e. frontal and/or side impact or a vehicle rollover situation), which could result in severe injuries.

Kenworth has initiated a recall to replace the huck bolts on the cab attaching structure of the left-hand door aperture. You are urged to immediately contact your nearest authorized Kenworth dealer to have this work completed. This work may take up to one day and will be performed at no charge to you.

If you believe you had this repair made prior to receiving this notification, please contact your nearest dealership for possible reimbursement.
