DEFECT INFORMATION REPORT

1. Manufacturer:

Nissan Motor Co., Ltd.

2. Vehicles Potentially Involved:

2003 – 2004 model year Infiniti G35 sedan/coupe vehicles produced from November 9, 2001 through October 9, 2003; 2003 - 2004 model year Nissan 350Z vehicles produced from April 17, 2002 through November 3, 2003; and 2003-2006 model year Infiniti FX45/35 vehicles produced from July 31, 2002 through August 30, 2005. Vehicles manufactured prior to and after these dates are not affected. No other Nissan models use the same fuel filler hose as the subject vehicles.

3. Total Number of Vehicles Potentially Involved:

Approximately 192,659

4. Percentage of Vehicles Estimated to Actually Contain the Defect:

Unknown

5. <u>Description of the Defect:</u>

The subject fuel filler hose may crack from exposure to ozone due to an inappropriate production quality control process. This could cause the malfunction indicator light (MIL) in the instrument panel to come on as a result of the onboard diagnostic system detecting a leak in the evaporative emission control system and could also result in fuel leakage from the hose while refueling.

6. Chronology of Principal Events:

May, 2005 - Nissan received reports of the malfunction indicator light (MIL) coming on due to cracks in the fuel filler hose.

May – November, 2005 – Nissan conducted an investigation to determine the scope and potential safety impact of a cracked fuel filler.

November 21, 2005 - Nissan determined that a safety related defect might exist and that a recall campaign should be conducted.

7. Description of Corrective Action:

The fuel filler hose will be replaced with a new one.

Nissan plans to notify dealers by December 12, 2005 and begin notifying owners of potentially affected vehicles on February 13, 2006.
