PRODUCT SAFETY RECALL #05010 – January 20, 2005

- General Motors has decided that a defect, which relates to motor vehicle safety, exists in **certain** 2005 Chevrolet Silverado and GMC Sierra vehicles. The bolt that attaches the intermediate steering shaft to the steering gear may not meet specification. The bolt may fracture, resulting in the loss of steering. If this happens while the vehicle is moving, a crash could occur without prior warning
- Dealers are to replace the intermediate steering shaft to steering gear bolt.

If your business associate code is not listed, then none of the involved vehicles are assigned to your dealership. The bolt that attaches the intermediate steering shaft to the steering gear may not meet specification. The bolt may fracture resulting in the loss of steering. If this happens while the vehicle is moving, a crash could occur without prior warning. Dealers are to replace the intermediate steering shaft to steering gear bolt.
