Dear Ms. Schuler:

Pursuant to my voice message of today, this is a follow-up to the report dated February 7, 2005, filed by Robert Bosch Corporation ("Bosch") with NHTSA concerning certain Hydro-Boost® hydraulic brake boosters manufactured by Bosch. As you are aware, General Motors Corporation ("GMC") has filed a report dated February 4, 2005, with NHTSA in which GMC reports its determination of a safety related defect in certain of the Bosch boosters as installed in certain GMC vehicles.

You had asked whether Bosch shipped any of the subject boosters to aftermarket customers that are not controlled by one of the parties referenced in the February 7th Bosch report.

In response to your question, Table 1 on the next page sets forth the aftermarket shipments of the subject boosters, divided into two groups: (i) parties which were referenced on the initial Bosch report to NHTSA; and (ii) parties which were not referenced on the initial Bosch report to NHTSA.

The aftermarket parts shipped to parties which were referenced on the initial Bosch report to NHTSA are to be handled by the referenced parties.

The estimated number of boosters shipped to parties not referenced in the initial Bosch report to NHTSA, which will exhibit the defect reported by General Motors, is less than one booster.
