



- Check the brake light switch and make sure it is not a threaded-type switch. The threaded type brake light switch is not included in this recall; do not replace a threaded-type switch.
- 3. Working under the dash, disconnect the brake light switch plug connector.
- 4. Turn the switch 90 degrees in either direction and then remove the switch from the brake pedal bracket hole.


- 5. Prepare a new brake light switch for installation.
- 6. The new switch has two terminals only and replaces any switch that may have four terminals.
- 7. Pull out the switch plunger to its maximum extension. This will take some force.













- 8. Connect the brake light switch plug connector into the new switch.
- 9. Depress and hold the brake pedal. Insert the brake light switch into the brake pedal bracket hole.



10. Turn the brake light switch 90 degrees in either direction to the locked position.





11. With the plunger still at it's maximum extension release the pedal slowly until it contacts the head of the plunger of the brake light switch.

NOTE:

The brake light switch self adjusts when the brake pedal contacts the plunger. If the brake lights remain ON after installing the switch, push the pedal down and pull the plunger out again. The switch will readjust when the pedal is released.

- 12. Check to see if the brake lights now function as intended.

Brake Light Switch

MODEL: Certain 2004 Forenza and 2004 Verona

Suzuki Motor Corporation has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2004 Suzuki Forenza and 2004 Suzuki Verona vehicles.

Affected vehicles have a brake light switch that may become misadjusted if an upward/rearward force is applied to the brake pedal. If this should occur, the brake light switch will not function properly causing the brake lights, including the high mounted stop lamp, to remain illuminated continuously without service brake pedal application, with the ignition switch in the on or off position. This condition may also discharge the vehicle's battery, and the Automatic Transmission Torque Converter Clutch, Cruise Control and Traction Control System, if equipped, will become disabled.

ASMC is requesting that Suzuki dealers replace the brake light switch on affected vehicles without cost to the customer.

This notice is being sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Suzuki Motor Corporation has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2004 Suzuki Forenza and 2004 Suzuki Verona vehicles. According to our records, you own one of the vehicles affected by this recall.

Affected vehicles have a brake light switch that may become misadjusted if an upward/rearward force is applied to the brake pedal. This condition could occur if your foot slips off the brake pedal or if you pull up on the brake pedal with the top of your foot. If this should occur, the brake light switch will not function properly, causing the brake lights, including the high mounted stop lamp, to remain illuminated continuously without brake pedal application, with the ignition switch in the on or off position. If the brake lights remain on continuously while driving, a following driver may not know when your brakes have been applied, and a rear-end crash could occur without prior warning. This condition may also discharge the vehicle's battery, and, the Automatic Transmission Torque Converter Clutch, Cruise Control and Traction Control System, if equipped, will become disabled.

To correct the above problem, your Suzuki dealer will replace the brake light switch on your vehicle at no cost to you for parts or labor. If you must drive your vehicle before having the recall repair performed, be careful not to let your foot slip off the brake pedal and not to pull up on the brake pedal with the top of your foot.
