Re: Amended affected population for Safety Recall # 06V-267; Coachmen Recreational Vehicle Company, LLC. d/b/a Georgie Boy Manufacturing – Overhead TV Cabinet

Dear Mr. Person;

Coachmen Recreational Vehicle Company, LLC d/b/a Georgie Boy Manufacturing has determined that it is necessary to extend the affected population of units potentially affected by our existing recall campaign # 06V-267.

The Part 573 originally filed reported the total population of potentially affected vehicles to be certain 2006 and 2007 MY Georgie Boy Landau, Georgie Boy Pursuit and Georgie Boy Cruise Master, Class A motorhomes, manufactured at Coachmen RV's Middlebury, Indiana facility from January 21, 2006 through July 6, 2006. In that filing, we had reported that at total of 222 units were potentially affected by this defect.

We have subsequently determined that the potential for this defect exist in additional models produced at our Edwardsburg, Michigan facility. The revised affected population is as follows:

Certain 2005 MY Georgie Boy Landau, Pursuit, Cruise Master, Cruise Master LE, Cruise Air XL and Bellagio, and 2006 and 2007 MY Georgie Landau, Pursuit and Cruise Master, Cruise Master LE Class A motorhomes manufactured between April 27, 2004 and July 6, 2006.

The revised total of units potentially affected by this defect is 1485.


Coachmen determined that it was necessary to extend the affected population after investigating a claim received from one of our dealers relating to the failure of an overhead TV cabinet in a Georgie Boy model that was not included in this recall. It was determined that the nature of that defect was the same as that presented in this recall campaign. Consequently, we believe that we should extend the affected population to include all Georgie Boy model motorhomes that use this particular television and overhead television cabinet combination.

Attached is a copy of our revised owner notification letter for your review that includes the additional models affected. We will begin the extended mailing campaign within 5 days of your approval of this letter.

Dear Georgie Boy Owner:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Georgie Boy has decided that a defect that relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2005, 2006 and 2007 MY Georgie Boy Landau, Pursuit, Cruise Master, Cruise Master LE, Cruise Air XL, Bellagio, Class A motorhomes manufactured between April 27, 2004 and July 6, 2006.

SAFETY DEFECT

On affected units, the cabinet containing the television in the center of the cockpit overhead may be inadequately secured. Should the television cabinet become unsecured during travel, the cabinet and television assembly may become detached from the cockpit overhead and fall down, potentially contacting the windshield, driver or front seat passenger resulting in either a crash or personal injury.

REPAIRS

PLEASE TAKE YOUR UNIT PROMPTLY TO YOUR GEORGIE BOY DEALER. At no charge to you, the dealer will perform the necessary repairs. The required repair procedure should not take more than one (1) hour.

REFUNDS

If you have paid to have this service performed prior to receiving this notice you can receive a full refund. Please mail your paid original invoice or receipt to Georgie Boy RV Service, P.O. Box 1000, Middlebury, Indiana 46540.

CHANGED ADDRESS OR SOLD THE VEHICLE?

Please fill out the enclosed pre-paid postcard and mail it to us if you have changed your address or sold the vehicle. Any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within ten days.
