

Owner's Letter

Dear Infiniti owner:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Infiniti has decided that the headlamps and rear combination lamps on some 2003 through 2006 model year Infiniti FX35 and FX45 vehicles fail to comply with certain requirements in Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 108, "Lamps, Reflective Devices and Associated Equipment."

Reason for Recall

FMVSS No. 108 specifies, among other things, the performance requirements for headlamps, rear stop, tail, and turn signal lamps in passenger vehicles. One of these requirements specifies their minimum and maximum light intensity at certain test points. Another specifies the vertical gradient values for headlamps. The headlamps and rear combination lamps in your vehicle may not meet these requirements. This means that the headlamps may be too bright when viewed at certain angles and, due to the vertical gradient, the headlamp aim may be difficult to adjust. Increased brightness and improper aiming of headlamps can increase glare. Also, the headlamps and rear combination lamps may be too dim when viewed at certain angles. Reduced visibility increases the risk of your vehicle being involved in a crash.

All other requirements of FMVSS No. 108 are met.

What Infiniti Will Do

Your Infiniti dealer will replace your headlamps and rear combination lamps with new compliant lamps.

What You Should Do

Please contact your Infiniti dealer and make an appointment to have them install the new headlamps and rear combination lamps at **no charge** to you. Please bring this notice with you when you keep your service appointment. If the dealer fails, or is unable to make the necessary repairs free of charge, you may contact the National Consumer Affairs Department, Infiniti Division, Nissan North America, Inc., P.O.
