Please find enclosed MasterCraft Boat Company, LLC's ("MasterCraft") Vehicle Safety Recall Report for the second calendar quarter of 2009 for NHTSA Safety Recall Campaign Number 06V-335. MasterCraft provides this quarterly report in accordance with Title 49 of the United States Code, Chapter 301, and per the form provided by NHTSA.

As stated in MasterCraft's previously filed Safety Recall Report for the fourth quarter of 2006, of the 174 trailers involved in this Trailer Wheel Recall, only 11 trailers had been sold to consumers at the time that the Notification Letters were delivered to consumers and MasterCraft's authorized dealers. Of the 11 certified Notification Letters sent to consumers, none were returned as "undeliverable" or "unclaimed." Of the 11 trailers sold to consumers, 4 were inspected and/or repaired. As set forth in the Report, 72 of the total 174 trailers in the recall population have been reported as having been inspected by MasterCraft's authorized dealers, but MasterCraft continues to believe that significantly more than that number have been inspected, because if the dealer did not find that the condition existed, then they may not have submitted the required documentation for reimbursement for the time necessary to conduct the inspection. MasterCraft has only reported as "inspected" those trailers for which we have received appropriate documentation from the dealer verifying that the inspection has occurred.

Of the 72 that MasterCraft has verified as having been inspected, 59 of the trailers did not require remedial repair work. As shown on the enclosed Report, no additional trailers that are within the recall population have been inspected and/or repaired since the date of the May 12, 2009 Report for the First Quarter of 2009 (Report No. 9).

Due to the number of trailers affected in this recall and the number of trailers inspected and/or repaired to date, and based upon the length of time that this recall has been open (more than 2 ½ years) MasterCraft requests the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to consider termination of this recall at this time since the inspection and repair rate is now at approximately forty-two percent (42%).

Of course, MasterCraft will continue to strive to achieve one hundred percent (100%) compliance with the recall. In that regard, MasterCraft will, of course, continue to stress to its dealers the importance of performing the necessary inspection of remaining trailers in dealer inventory in connection with this recall and will continue to encourage them, through the "Service Connection" bulletins, to fulfill their obligation as to the inspection and the replacement of any wheels found to be non-conforming.
