RE: VEHICLE DEFECT NOTIFICATION, 06V-097

Dear Country Coach Service Provider:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

DESCRIPTION OF NONCOMPLIANCE:

Country Coach, Inc. has decided that certain motor homes it manufactured fail to conform to Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 120, *Tire selection and rims for motor vehicles other than passenger*. The noncompliance condition is related to an erroneously assigned inadequate recommended cold inflation pressure for only the front tires. As a result, these motor homes do not comply with Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 120, *Tire selection and rims for vehicles other than passenger cars*. In some cases, this noncompliance could cause premature rear tire tread wear resulting in a potential tire failure during normal driving, which could result in a crash without prior warning.

Model Year 2005; Affinity motor home manufactured from September 2004 through January 2005

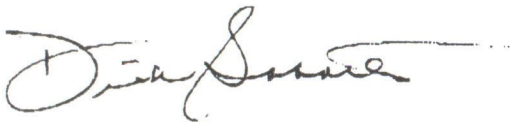
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Country Coach will issue replacement Federal tire label reflecting the corrected cold tire inflation pressure for the front tires. The Front Axle Weight Rating (FAWR) of these motor homes is 18,000 lbs. The original Federal tire label show a cold tire inflation pressure of 120 PSI that supports only 16,500 pounds of weight carrying capacity. The replacement Federal tire label will have a cold tire inflation pressure of 130 PSI that will support 18,000 pounds. At the corrected cold tire inflation pressure of 130 PSI the weight carrying capacity of the tires meets the FAWR. The Federal tire labels will be provided at no cost to motor home owners. The labor required to remove and replace the Federal tire label is not expected to exceed one-quarter (1/4) hour.

If the condition is not adequately repaired within a reasonable time, the owner may be entitled to an identical or reasonably equivalent motor home at no charge or to a refund of the purchase price less a reasonable allowance for depreciation.

To avoid having to provide these burdensome solutions, every effort must be made to promptly schedule an appointment with owners and to repair their motor homes as soon as possible. You should be aware that owners are instructed to contact the customer service department if their dealer does not remedy the condition within three (3) days of the mutually agreed upon service date. (Please see the enclosed Letter to Country Coach Owners) Owners are also advised to contact the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration if the condition is not remedied without charge and within a reasonable time.
