ON CERTAIN PICKUP TRUCKS EQUIPPED WITH A SPEED CONTROL SYSTEM,
THE SPEED CONTROL DEACTIVATION SWITCH MAY, UNDER CERTAIN
CONDITIONS, LEAK INTERNALLY AND THEN OVERHEAT, SMOKE, OR BURN.

Consequence:
THIS COULD RESULT IN AN UNDERHOOD FIRE.

Remedy:

DEALERS WILL INSTALL A FUSED WIRING HARNESS. THE RECALL IS EXPECTED TO BEGIN ON AUGUST 31, 2007. OWNERS MAY CONTACT MAZDA AT 1-800-222-5500.

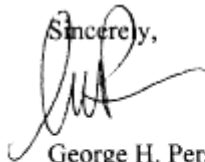
This recall was the subject of an Engineering Analysis, EA05-005, conducted by the Office of Defects Investigation.

As stated in Part 573.7, submission of the first of six consecutive quarterly status reports is required within one month after the close of the calendar quarter in which notification to purchasers occurs. Therefore, the first quarterly report will be due on or before 30 days after the close of the calendar quarter.
