REASON FOR THIS SUPPLEMENT

Some Anti-lock Brake System (ABS) module and connector inspections are <u>being claimed but not</u> <u>completed</u> as directed in the repair instructions. Complete adherence to <u>all</u> the repair instructions provided in the safety recall is <u>mandatory</u>.

- Some customers have reported that ABS warning lights, melted connectors, smoke, or fire incidents have occurred on vehicles that **have had** the field service action completed.
- The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has opened an investigation into the adequacy of recall repairs conducted by our dealer technicians based on these post-repair incidents.
- Ford evaluation of vehicles that have reported a post recall issue revealed:
 - o In all cases, labor operation 07S51A (inspection, no issues identified, apply grease and release) was submitted on the recall warranty claim.
 - o In some cases, the dress cover on the ABS module connector <u>was not removed</u>, so seal inspection could not have been completed.
 - o In other cases, it is clear that grease was not applied, or incorrect grease was used (including a non-specified dielectric grease and even non-dielectric grease).

Conclusion:

Improper or incomplete inspection and repair by the dealer is unacceptable to Ford and may violate federal or state laws. Complete and thorough adherence to the repair instructions provided is **required** by Ford and our customers. Ford is requesting your personal involvement to ensure that your service team fully completes all steps of the inspection and repair instructions when performing Safety Recall 07S51.

Incorrect or incomplete repairs will be subject to chargeback.

We appreciate your dedication to the safety of our customers.

AFFECTED VEHICLES

Certain 2001-2004 model year Ford Escape vehicles equipped with Anti-Lock Brakes built at the Kansas City and Ohio Assembly Plants from Job 1 to Job Last. Affected vehicles are identified in OASIS. In addition, for a list of vehicles assigned to your dealership, visit https://web.fsavinlists.dealerconnection.com. This information was made available on April 10, 2007.

REASON FOR THIS SAFETY RECALL

In a small percentage of the affected vehicles, the Anti-Lock Brake System (ABS) module connector may have missing or dislodged wire seals. This condition could allow contamination to enter the module connector, creating a potential for an electrical short. An electrical short might cause an ABS malfunction that would illuminate the ABS warning light, and in some cases, the module may overheat resulting in burning odor, smoke, and/or fire. This condition could occur either when the vehicle ignition switch is in the off position or while the vehicle is being operated.

SERVICE ACTION

Dealers are to verify that no corrosion exists in the electrical connector on the ABS module. In addition, the ABS wiring harness connector must be inspected for missing or dislodged wire seals. If the wiring harness connector contains seals that are out of position, the wire harness connector will need to be repaired. If the seals are missing from the wiring harness connector, or if it has the wrong mat seal number, a replacement pigtail must be spliced into the circuit. If corrosion is present in the ABS module connector, the module must be replaced. After completion of the inspection and/or repair, electrical grease is to be applied to the ABS module connector.

It is anticipated that approximately 97% of the affected vehicles <u>will not</u> have sealing issues with the connector or corrosion in the ABS module.

These repairs will be performed free of charge (parts and labor).

OWNER NOTIFICATION MAILING SCHEDULE

Owners of affected vehicles were notified during the week of April 23, 2007. Owners that had the Interim Repair performed were notified during the last week in June, 2007 to return to their dealer to have a new ABS Module installed. Dealers should inspect and repair, if necessary, any affected vehicles that arrive at their dealerships, whether or not the customer has received a letter.

PLEASE NOTE:

Federal law requires dealers to complete this recall service before a new vehicle is delivered to the buyer or lessee. Violation of this requirement by a dealer could result in a civil penalty of up to \$6,000 per vehicle. Correct all vehicles in your new vehicle inventory before delivery.

STOCK VEHICLES

Correct all affected units in your new vehicle inventory before delivery.

SOLD VEHICLES

- Owners of affected vehicles have been directed to dealers for repairs.
- Immediately contact any of your affected owners whose vehicles are not on your VIN lists but are identified in OASIS. Give the owner a copy of the Customer Notification Letter and schedule a service date.
- Correct other affected vehicles identified in OASIS which are brought to your dealership.

TITLE BRANDED / SALVAGED VEHICLES

Affected title branded and salvaged vehicles are eligible for this Field Service Action.

RELATED DAMAGE

If a related damage condition exists that you believe to be caused by the covered condition, call the Special Service Support Center to request approval **prior** to the repair of any related damage. Requests for approval after completion of the repair will not be granted. Ford Motor Company reserves the right to deny coverage for related damage in cases where the vehicle owner has not had this recall performed on a timely basis.

ADDITIONAL LABOR TIME

If a condition exists that requires additional labor to complete the repair, call the Special Service Support Center to request approval **prior** to performing any additional labor. Requests for approval after completion of the repair will not be granted.

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OWNER REFUNDS

- Ford Motor Company is offering a refund for owner-paid repairs covered by this recall if the
 repair was performed prior to the date indicated in the reimbursement plan, which is posted
 with this bulletin. This plan is also available to owners through the Customer Relationship
 Center (CRC). The CRC will direct owners to seek reimbursement through authorized dealers
 or, at their option, directly through Ford Motor Company at P.O. Box 6251, Dearborn, MI
 48121-6251.
- Dealers are also authorized to refund owner-paid emergency repairs that were performed away from an authorized servicing dealer after the end date specified in the reimbursement plan. Refund claims that include other non-covered repairs, or those judged by Ford to be excessive, will not be accepted for reimbursement.
- This safety recall must still be performed, even if the customer has paid for a previous repair. Claiming a refund will not close the recall on the vehicle.

RENTAL VEHICLES

If an ABS module needs to be ordered, Ford Motor Company will pay for a rental vehicle, except for fuel and insurance which will be at the owner's expense. Follow Extended Service Plan (ESP) guidelines for rental dollar amounts. Enter the word "RENTAL" plus the number of days the vehicle was used in the Miscellaneous Expense area of the recall claim form.

CLAIMS PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION

- Enter claims using Direct Warranty Entry (DWE).
- **Handling Allowance:** An allowance of \$1.00 per repair is being provided to cover the costs of locally obtained materials and XG-12 Electrical Grease. To claim the allowance, enter \$1.00 as "HANDLG" in the "MISC EXPENSE" area of the claim form.
- Refund or related damage must be claimed on a repair line that is separate from the repair line on which the FSA is claimed. Related damage requires approval from Special Service Support Center
- "MT" labor should be submitted on a separate repair line with the related damage flag checked. "MT" labor requires approval from Special Service Support Center.
- Refer to ACESII manual for claims preparation and submission information.
