**Re: Notice of Safety Recall of Fuel Pumps
Delphi part numbers FG0170-11B1, FG0049-11B1, MU55 and MU269
NHTSA Recall # 07E-015**

Dear Sir or Madam:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Delphi Corporation has determined that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in a small quantity of fuel modules that were sold between 24Oct06 and 2Feb07.

The defect is associated with the incorrect assembly of the fuel return tube and vent tube. The two tube positions were switched when assembled by a supplier of Delphi. The following two scenarios can result from the use of a non-conforming fuel pump module:

- The vehicle may stall due to an overly rich fuel blend. A stalled vehicle can increase the risk of a vehicle crash.
- The vehicle's evaporative emission carbon canister may leak fuel which could result in a fire.

Note: THIS RECALL ONLY PERTAINS TO SERVICE AND AFTERMARKET FUEL PUMP MODULES AND HAS NO APPLICATION TO GM FACTORY-INSTALLED FUEL PUMP MODULES.

Delphi Corporation has initiated a program to inspect vehicles and subsequently replace any non-conforming fuel pumps at no charge to the vehicle owners. Please complete the following instructions to determine whether you need to have your vehicle inspected.

1. If you own one of the following motor vehicles and if you installed or had a mechanic or garage install an **AFTERMARKET OR SERVICE** fuel pump

module on the vehicle between October 24, 2006 and February 2, 2007, proceed to step 4.

- 1996-1998 Pontiac Grand Am
 - 1996-1998 Pontiac Sunfire
 - 1996-1998 Chevrolet Cavalier
 - 1996-1998 Oldsmobile Achieva
 - 1996-1998 Buick Skylark
2. If you own one of the vehicles listed above and have not had a fuel pump module replaced, or had one replaced before October 24, 2006 or after February 2, 2007, proceed to step 3.
 3. Your fuel pump module **is not** covered by this recall. You may visit <http://iam.delphi.com/recall/fpm> or call **1-877-335-7443** for confirmation and no further action is required.
 4. Your fuel pump module **may be** covered by this recall. Please visit <http://iam.delphi.com/recall/fpm> or call **1-877-335-7443** for instructions on determining whether you are impacted by this recall and additional information on having your vehicle inspected if you are affected. You will need to have your vehicle VIN and the date of fuel pump module replacement when visiting the website or calling the number provided. If the fuel pump module is found to be subject to this recall, it will be inspected and, if necessary, replaced **at no cost to you**.
