Subject: 07KW2 – Primaax Rear Suspension – Brake Timing

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Kenworth Truck Company has decided that some T800, W900, C500 and T2000 models manufactured May 23, 2005 to January 14, 2007, with Primaax Rear Suspension and wheelbase from 300 inches to 349 inches fail to comply with the brake timing regulatory requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard No. 121, "Air Brake Systems". Your vehicle has been identified as possibly having been manufactured with this defect.

The length of brake line and single relay valve result in the subject vehicles not meeting the brake actuation and release timing requirements set forth in US or Canadian Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard 121 Air Brake Systems.

Kenworth has implemented a recall to convert the subject vehicles from a single relay valve to a dual relay value system. Please contact your Kenworth dealer immediately to schedule an appointment for this repair. This procedure should take no more than four hours and will be performed at no charge to you. If you had this repair performed before you received this letter, you may be eligible to receive reimbursement for the cost of obtaining a pre-notification remedy of the problem associated with this recall.

If you require further information about this recall, reimbursement of a pre-notification remedy associated with this recall or experience any difficulty in making arrangements for this repair, please contact: Kenworth Truck Company, P.O.
