

1. All trailers must have a tire placard label to permanently affix on the drive's side of tow bar near VIN plate
2. Every trailer has a VIN in our file when the trailer was manufactured
3. Manufacturer of trailer between the included date is from September 1, 2005 to December 31, 2008

The trailer does not comply with requirement of FMVSS No. 110, Tire selection and rim for motor vehicle with a GVWR of 4,536 kilogram (10,000 pound) or less and Regulation Parts 575 consumer information regulation.

1. Long Chih trailer does not comply with requirement of FMVSS No. 110 between the included manufactured date was from September 1, 2005 to December 31, 2008
2. Obtain a mailing list of current registered owners using State motor vehicle registration records.
3. Mail tire placard label and correct GVWR label and owner letter to trailer owner to affix to the driver's side of trailer tow bar and near VIN plate.
4. Long Chih Company will remedy that noncompliance without charge.

Clearly describe the distinguishing characteristics of the remedy component/assembly versus the recalled component/assembly.

1. The placard and corrected GVWR are label with viscose shown the tire size, tire pressure and cargo loading weight limited
2. Reporting Safety Defects is a statement if trailer owner believe that the vehicle has a defect which could cause a crash or could cause injury or death, owner should immediately inform the NHTSA

1. From January 1, 2009, all Long Chih trailers were corrected in production for requirement of FMVSS Standards
