4. <u>Percentage of Vehicles Estimated to Actually Experience Noncompliance:</u>

5. <u>Description of Noncompliance</u>:

The air bag label installed on the driver side sun visor of certain Toyota Corolla vehicles can separate from the surface of the visor. These vehicles fail to comply with FMVSS 208 S4.5.1 (b), which requires vehicles certified to meet the requirements specified in S19, S21, or S23 on or after September 1, 2003 shall have a label permanently affixed to either side of sun visor, at the manufacturer's option, at each front outboard seating position that is equipped with an inflatable restraint.

6. Test results and other information

Toyota received a Field Technical Report which indicated that the driver side sun visor air bag label was almost completely separated from the visor surface. Toyota identified that some vinyl sun visors incorrectly had the label for fabric sun visor installed by the supplier. The label for the fabric sun visor, if installed onto a vinyl sun visor, will not adhere properly.

7. Description of Corrective Repair Action:

All known owners of the subject vehicles will be notified by first class mail to return their vehicle to a Toyota dealer for inspection of the label and an exchange of the driver's side sun visor if necessary.

Reimbursement Plan for pre-notification remedies

Per 49 CFR 573.13(m), reimbursement does not apply.

8. Recall Schedule:

Mailing of the owner notifications will commence in early September, 2009 and will be completed in late October, 2009.

Copies of the owner notification and dealer instructions will be submitted as soon as they are available.

9. <u>Distributor/Dealer Notification Schedule:</u>

Notifications to distributors/dealers will be sent in late August, 2009.
