Dear Associate Administrator:

Pursuant to 49 CFR Part 573, Monaco RV, LLC (“Monaco” or the “Company”) is submitting this report to NHTSA concerning a safety recall campaign, which is being voluntarily initiated. Specific information is as follows:

573.6(c)(2)

The affected vehicles include certain 2010 travel trailers with Gross Vehicle Weight Ratings (GVWR) under 10,000 lbs.:

Holiday Rambler: Campmaster (3) and Savoy LX Travel Trailer (2)

R-Vision: Trail Cruiser Classic (5); Trail Cruiser Ultra Lite (2); Trail Lite Travel Trailer (2); Trail Sport (27); and Trail-Lite Crossover (6)

The affected vehicles were manufactured from September 26, 2008 through July 23, 2009 and shipped to dealers between June 30, 2009 and August 18, 2009.

The recall population was determined from the manufacturing records for the Company’s manufacturing facilities in Coburg, OR, Warsaw, IN and Wakarusa, IN which produced the affected vehicles.

573.6(c)(3)

A total of ninety-eight (98) vehicles are in the total recall population. Of this total, forty-seven (47) are in the recall population for the United States and fifty-one (51) were exported.

573.6(c)(4)

Monaco will be campaigning one hundred percent (100%) of the recall population.

573.6(c)5

Monaco has become aware that the Tire and Loading Information Label, as required by 49 CFR part 571.110, was printed with incorrect information. The weight listed for cargo exceeds the actual cargo carrying capacity of the trailer. The weights were calculated without factoring in the unloaded weights of the vehicles. This incorrect information could lead to an overloading situation that could cause or contribute to the failure of frame components; possibly resulting in a sudden tire blowout or other failure which could result in a loss of control of the unit.

573.6(c)7

A Monaco employee noticed the discrepancy. Monaco is currently not aware of any casualties or losses related to this issue.

573.6(c)8

Monaco RV, LLC will be sending a notification letter to all current owners of the vehicles in the recall population. The remedy will involve placing a corrected Tire and Loading Information Label on the trailer. This remedy will be done at no cost to the owner.

Copies of the drafts of owner and dealer notification letters will be forwarded for your review shortly. Repair instructions and final owner and dealer notification letters will be provided pending approval and recall number. The Company expects to begin owner and dealer notifications in September 2009 after approvals are granted.

Please acknowledge receipt of this defect information report and provide the recall number that will be assigned by NHTSA to this campaign.
