This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Oshkosh Corporation (Oshkosh) has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain motor vehicles manufactured by Oshkosh and containing certain air brake system control valves manufactured by Haldex Brake Products Corporation (Haldex). According to Oshkosh records, you purchased one (or more) vehicles potentially containing a Haldex valve that is included in this recall.

Haldex has advised Oshkosh and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration that certain air brake system control valves manufactured by Haldex and installed on certain vehicles manufactured by Oshkosh are subject to delamination of the diaphragm inside the quick release valve due to inadequate adhesive and/or incomplete bonding during the Haldex manufacturing process. A delaminated valve may cause air leakage past and/or through the diaphragm in excess of permissible specifications, or could cause a restriction in the air flow, thereby effecting pressure delivery to the foundation brakes. An undetected increase in air leakage or an undetected air line restriction could lead to a vehicle crash.

In the enclosed bulletin, Haldex has identified precautions that you can take to detect degradation in braking performance, pending inspection of your vehicle and valve replacement, if needed. The enclosed Haldex bulletin provides instructions for identifying whether the valves on your vehicles are covered by this recall. The bulletin also includes instructions for replacing recalled valves. Please follow the Haldex instructions to determine whether you need to replace your valves.

If you determine that you have any valves that need to be replaced under this recall, please contact Mark Weaver at 920-235-9151 and advise of the number of replacement valves you need. Oshkosh will arrange to ship you the appropriate number of replacement valves.

If you believe that Oshkosh has failed or is unable to remedy the defect without charge within a reasonable time, please contact Mr. Weaver of Oshkosh at the above phone number.
