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The issue involves the vehicle's fuel level sensor within the fuel tank. A lever that is a part of the sensor could become wedged against the tank. If this happened, the fuel gauge in the instrument cluster would display a larger amount of fuel than was actually in the tank. As a result, if the tank became empty, stalling would occur.
