Dear Peterbilt Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Peterbilt has decided that a safety defect which relates to motor vehicle safety may exist with certain Medium Duty vehicles built between November 28, 2008 and May 10, 2010. Your vehicle has been identified as having been manufactured within this time period and may contain a defect.

Affected vehicles may have a non-operational hood anti-blowdown device. In normal operation, the hood anti-blowdown device is automatically set and prevents the hood from closing. A non-operational anti-blowdown device may not prevent an unintentional closing of the hood which can increase the risk of personal injury and/or vehicle damage. Peterbilt is recalling these vehicles to install a new anti-blowdown device. Once the repair is complete, the dealer will also provide an operator manual supplement describing the function of the new device.

Peterbilt has initiated a recall to install a new hood anti-blowdown device. Please contact your authorized Peterbilt dealer immediately to schedule an appointment. The service should take no more than 1 hour and will be provided at no charge to you.

If you conclude that Peterbilt has not enabled you to remedy this defect within a reasonable time and without charge, you may submit a complaint to: The Administrator, National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, 1200 New Jersey Avenue SE, Washington DC 20590, or call the toll free Safety Hotline at 1-888-327-4236 (TTY: 1-800-424-9153); or go to <http://www.safercar.gov>.

Federal regulation requires that any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within ten days. If you no longer own this vehicle, we would appreciate your advising us of the new owner if you know their name. The enclosed card may be used for this purpose.
