573.6(c)(5): Description of Defect or Noncompliance

Some vehicles may experience an HVAC condensate leak from the HVAC drain grommet onto the Occupant Restraint Control (ORC) module, which can lead to the illumination of the airbag warning light and a potential inadvertent airbag deployment without warning.

573.6(c)(6): Chronology of Principal Events Leading to Determination of a Safety Defect

- In November, 2010, Chrysler Group LLC authorized voluntary Safety Recall K25 to replace the HVAC Drain Tube and Grommet to eliminate the potential for water condensate to enter the ORC module.
- At the time of the campaign, the remedy was believed to be sufficient. However, as a precaution, Chrysler Group LLC continued its evaluation of the potential performance of ORC modules with prior exposure to HVAC condensate in the field.
- ORC modules with prior exposure to HVAC condensate were removed from the field and tested to determine the effect of prior exposure to HVAC condensate after the source of the condensate leak had been removed.
- In July of 2011, Chrysler Group LLC's test program was completed. The results indicated that a small percentage of the modules did not meet the stringent performance criteria for some portion of the testing and contained electronically stored fault codes indicating a condition that could result in an inadvertent airbag deployment.
- There have been no confirmed reports of an inadvertent airbag deployment on a vehicle that had the prior recall complete (K25).
- The affected vehicles will have the ORC module replaced.
- This information was presented to the Vehicle Regulations Committee on July 26, 2011, which decided to conduct a voluntary safety recall.

573.6(c)(8): Description of Remedy

Conduct a voluntary safety recall to replace the ORC module on all affected vehicles.

Chrysler has a longstanding policy and practice of reimbursing owners who have incurred the cost of repairing a problem that subsequently becomes the subject of a field action. To ensure consistency, Chrysler, as part of the owner letter, will request that customers send the original receipt and/or other adequate proof of payment to the company for confirmation of the expense.
