Dear Mr. Harris:

The following information is submitted pursuant to the requirements of 49 CFR 573.6 as it applies to a determination by General Motors of a noncompliance involving certain 2012 model year Buick LaCrosse vehicles.

573.6(c)(1): Buick Brand of General Motors Company

573.6(c)(2)(3)(4): This information is shown on the attached sheet.

573.6(c)(5): General Motors has decided that certain 2012 model year Buick LaCrosse vehicles fail to conform to Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard, and proposed Canada Motor Vehicle Safety Standard, 126 - Electronic Stability Control Systems (ESC). In these vehicles, the StabiliTrak System has an incorrect calibration that may cause the system to not properly detect if a sensor were to malfunction, and the warning light indicating that the system is not operating would not illuminate as required in the Safety Standard. Not properly diagnosing a malfunctioning sensor may cause the ESC to falsely activate resulting in sudden changes in vehicle handling and deceleration, particularly at higher speeds, which may cause the driver difficulty in maintaining the vehicle's desired path of travel and desired vehicle speed, and could result in a crash without warning.

<u>573.6(c)(7)</u>: On July 13, 2011, during the release of 2013MY Electronic Stability Control (ESC) software, the supplier discovered a disabled Diagnostic Trouble Code (DTC) procedure. This was then traced back to 2012 production calibration release.

On July 18, 2011, a Product Investigation Engineer was assigned to work with the Engineering/Supplier in understanding the software issue and effect on the vehicle performance.

The issue was presented to the Field Performance Evaluation Review Committee and on August 1, 2011, the Executive Field Action Decision Committee decided to conduct a noncompliance recall.



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573.6(c)(8): Dealers are to reprogram the Electronic Brake Control Module.

GM sent the dealer bulletin on August 2, 2011 and anticipates sending owner letters by FedEx on August 5, 2011.

Pursuant to 577.11(e), GM does not plan to provide notice about reimbursement to owners because all involved vehicles are covered under the new vehicle warranty.

573.6(c)(10): GM provided copies of the dealer bulletin and owner letter under separate cover.
