Dear Skyline Dealer:

On June 24, 2011 Skyline contacted the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration to report a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety in certain 2011 and 2012 recreational vehicles manufactured between October 1, 2010 and April 30, 2011 at our Hemet, California facility.

Specifically, the brake system in certain 2011 recreational vehicles may have been contaminated.

CONTAMINATED BRAKES MAY FAIL TO PROPERLY STOP VEHICLE. FAILURE TO STOP VEHICLE PROPERLY MAY RESULT IN A LOSS OF CONTROL OF THE VEHICLE. THIS CONDITION MAY CAUSE A CRASH AND/OR INJURY WITHOUT WARNING.

Skyline has determined that a total of 544 vehicles have the potential to have contaminated brake systems. However we cannot determine if a vehicle is affected without performing an inspection of the brake system.

A representative from Lippert Components Inc. will contact you to schedule an inspection of recreational vehicles identified as potentially affected by the recall. Skyline's supplier, Lippert Components, Inc., will provide at no charge:

- On-site Visual inspection of the brakes
- Replacement of the affected brake assembly

Skyline apologizes for any inconvenience this may cause you or your customers. Thank you for your help in remedying this situation on a timely basis.
