The Dexter Axle DTS Actuator recall range list provided by Dexter axle in the notification letter was used to match against actuators sold to Anderson Manufacturing and trailers that were built/ or had actuators installed on within the specified date range of purchase. Dealers whose trailers were built or installations of axles occurred on that matched the criteria of the time frame and related recall part were notified to obtain the DTS Actuator number. These numbers were matched against the list provided by Dexter axle to determine if they were involved in the recall.
