### 2001-2002 Mazda Tribute Voluntary Safety Recall 6712A

Dear Mazda Owner:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Mazda Motor Corporation has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2001-2002 Tribute vehicles equipped with an Anti-Lock Brake System (ABS).

## If you are a recipient of this notice, your vehicle is included in this recall.

### What is the problem?

On certain 2001-2002 Tribute vehicles equipped with ABS, it may be possible that an electrical short might cause an Anti-Lock Brake System (ABS) malfunction that could illuminate the ABS warning light. In some cases, the module may overheat and result in a burning odor, smoke, and/or fire. This condition could occur either when the vehicle ignition switch is in the off position or while the vehicle is being operated.

Mazda previously notified affected Tribute owners of Safety Recall 4507C in May 2007. The 4507C notification informed owners to have the ABS module connector inspected and repaired as needed. This new Safety Recall 6712A will modify your vehicle's ABS system to provide additional protection against potential electrical shorts. It is very important that <u>both</u> Safety Recalls be performed on your vehicle.

### What should you do?

Our records indicate that both Safety Recall 4507C and 6712A are needed on your vehicle. Although parts are currently not available to complete Safety Recall 6712A, parts <u>are</u> available for Safety Recall 4507C. Please call your dealer without delay to schedule a service date for Safety Recall 4507C.

Mazda is concerned about your safety, so until both Safety Recalls 4507C and 6712A are performed, it is recommended that you park your vehicle outdoors away from structures to prevent a potential unattended fire from spreading, in the unlikely event that your ABS module develops an electrical short.

#### What will Mazda do?

Your Mazda dealer will inspect and provide any needed repairs to complete Safety Recall 4507C, free of charge. When parts for Safety Recall 6712A are available, you will be notified by Mazda via mail to schedule a service appointment with your dealer to have the repair performed, free of charge. The repair will take approximately one hour. Parts for this safety recall are expected to be available in the second quarter of 2012. We are closely working with our suppliers to accelerate parts availability.

#### Moved or no longer own this vehicle?

# Federal law requires that any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within ten days.
