Subject: Engine Oil Pan may Hit Road

This letter serves to acknowledge Campagna Motors's notification to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) of a safety recall which will be conducted pursuant to Federal law for the product(s) listed below. Potential Number of Units Affected: 230

Problem Description:

Campagna Motors (Campagna) is recalling certain model year 2007 and 2009-2013 T-Rex 1400R, 14R, and 14RR motorcycles manufactured September 1, 2006, to December 31, 2013, and equipped with Kawasaki 1352cc engines. Due to low ground clearance, the engine oil pan may hit the road or an object in the road.

Consequence:

Impacts to the engine oil pan could cause the oil drain bolt to push through the engine oil pan, resulting in an engine oil leak. The oil leak may cause a loss of rear-wheel traction, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy:

Campagna will notify owners, and dealers will replace the drain bolt with a flush one, free of charge. The recall is expected to begin in November 2014. Owners may contact Campagna customer service at 1-888-641-2112 extension 222.

We have received Campagna's proposed owner notification letter and it is currently under review. You will be notified of any changes or concerns once our review is complete.

Please be reminded of the following requirements:

Copies of all notices, bulletins, dealer notifications, and other communications that relate to this recall, including a copy of the final owner notification letter and any subsequent owner follow-up notification letter(s), are required to be submitted to this office no later than 5 days after they are originally sent (if they are sent to more than one manufacturer, distributor, dealer, or purchaser/owner).

As stated in Part 573.7, submission of the first of six consecutive quarterly status reports is required within one month after the close of the calendar quarter in which notification to purchasers occurs. Therefore, the first quarterly report will be due on, or before, 30 days after the close of the calendar quarter.
