- 3. The number of vehicles affected is approximately 6,400.
- 4. The percentage of vehicles estimated to contain the condition is approximately 50%.
- 5. This recall involves the rear side door lock mechanism that was not manufactured to correct tolerances on vehicles equipped with the Soft Close Automatic (SCA) option. When the inside door handle is pulled, it could disengage a previously engaged child safety lock. It would then be possible upon a second pull of the door handle, for a rear seat occupant to open the door while the vehicle is parked or in motion, increasing the risk of injury.

6. On March 5, 2014, BMW first became aware of this issue during audit testing on a vehicle built with the Soft Close Automatic (SCA) option. The child safety switch on the rear side door was able to be disengaged during actuation of the inside door handle. Immediately, the affected parts were sent to the supplier for analysis. On March 11, 2014, after examination and testing of the part, the supplier identified the root cause as the narrowing of the clearance between certain internal components of the locking system.

On March 12, 2014, the supplier determined from its component production records that the parts not produced to specification were built between October 28, 2013 and December 9, 2013. These parts are identifiable by date codes contained on the parts. However, it was not known which specific vehicles were manufactured with these parts.

Between March 17 and March 28, 2014, BMW internal reviews and analyses were conducted to confirm the defect in the affected parts and the parts production date range. Assembly plant documentation and quality control procedures were reviewed. It was determined that the supplier delivered defective parts to BMW between November 5, 2013 and December 12, 2013.

Production and manufacturing records were examined in order to determine the number and production range of potentially affected vehicles.

On April 10, 2014, BMW decided to conduct a voluntary recall.

BMW has not received any reports, nor is BMW otherwise aware, of any accidents or injuries related to this issue.

- 8. The rear side door locks will be inspected and, if the parts were produced during the specified date range, the locks will be replaced.
