RE: **Notice of Recall 2014-01 (NHTSA 14V-005) Sprinter brake line**

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Roadtrek Motorhomes Inc. has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain class "B" Mercedes Sprinter RSCM model motorhomes built between from February 14, 2013 to December 20, 2013.

Installation of coolant lines may have effected brake line routing allowing the brake line to come in contact with the Exhaust Gas Recirculation (EGR) Tube, causing abrasion damage which could result in a brake fluid leak. This could increase stopping distances, possibly resulting in a crash causing property damage and/or personal injury.

Corrective action requires that the brake line be inspected, relocated if needed and the coolant lines secured to the chassis frame rail. It should take 1.25 hours to complete the recall.
