Subject: Stop Delivery for Upcoming Safety and Emission Recall 7414D - 2014 Mazda6 Fuel in

Canister

On April 3, 2014, Mazda Motor Corporation filed a safety defect report with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to address a concern with certain 2014 Mazda6 vehicles produced from October 25, 2012 through May 9, 2013. Mazda has assigned recall number 7414D to this campaign.

Action Required:

Beginning today, April 4, 2014, certain 2014 Mazda6 vehicles in the VIN range below in your inventory must not be delivered to customers until the recall repair is completed. Recall repair instructions and special tools required for this repair will be provided to dealers in mid-April. Once the affected vehicles in dealer inventory have been repaired, retail delivery may resume.

On certain 2014 Mazda6 vehicles, it is possible that they can be refueled beyond the rated fuel tank capacity. If it occurs, followed by a large temperature change, the fuel volume may expand beyond the remaining vapor space in the fuel tank. Under this condition, fuel may potentially flow into the charcoal canister which is designed to control the evaporative emissions and the evaporative emission performance may be diminished. Furthermore, when the expanding amount of fuel exceeds the capacity of the canister, fuel may potentially leak from the external vent.

There are no reports of accidents or injuries occurring in Mazda vehicles as a result of this condition.

If a vehicle owner is concerned about driving their vehicle before this recall is launched, please advise the customer that if their vehicle is subject to this recall, they will receive a notice by mail near the end of April.
