On May 21, 2015, you received an email for Lion Bus, Inc. and informed you that your company had not yet submitted its second quarterly report for the first quarter of 2015 on its recall campaign.

We still have not received the requested, and required, report. See 49 U.S.C. 30120 and 49 CFR 573.7 and 573.9.

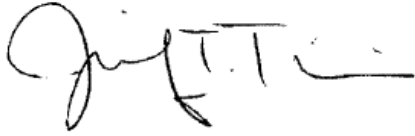
I urge your company to comply with its obligations and file this report through its secure, online recalls account. This documentation is necessary to ensure the proper administration and progress of a safety recall designed to remove products that are defective and/or fail to meet minimum safety standards from U.S. roadways, and a serious responsibility for us both.

Continued failure to produce the required documentation may result in a referral of your company to our Office of Chief Counsel for a potential enforcement action, including injunctive relief and/or civil penalties.
