

IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL

NHTSA RECALL 14C-001

March 2014

Dear Graco Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Graco has decided that a defect, which relates to motor vehicle safety, exists in the following car seat models, produced between 2006 and 2014, which have either the Signature, QT or QT3 harness buckle:

* Some seats manufactured after the end date were produced with buckles affected by this recall. If you have one of these seats, please check the date of manufacture. If the date matches any of the dates listed above, your seat is included in this recall.

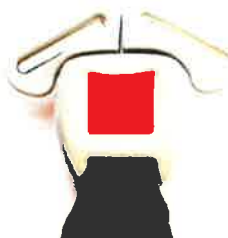


QT and QT3 Buckle

Specifically, the buckles may be difficult to unlatch or become stuck in the latched position making it difficult to remove a child from their car seat, and increasing the risk of injury in the event of an emergency requiring immediate exit from the vehicle.

Graco will replace affected buckles without charge. You may request a replacement buckle by calling 1-800-345-4109, emailing consumerservices@gracobaby.com, or filling out a form on Graco's website, <http://www.gracobaby.com>. Once you contact Graco, your order for the buckle repair kit will be placed within 48 hours. Delivery may take up to 6-8 weeks.

The repair kit will contain one of the following buckles shown below:



If the harness buckle on your car seat has a square red button as shown above on the left, your car seat already has Graco's new harness buckle and your car seat is not affected by this recall.

You may continue using your car seat until your buckle repair kit arrives. To reduce the chance of difficulty unlatching the buckle while you are waiting to receive your buckle repair kit, you can clean the buckles according to the instructions below. You can also view a cleaning video at <http://youtube/5NibYN-s-84> or clean per the following instructions:

- Remove the buckle from the car seat by turning the restraint over and pushing the retainer through the harness strap slot.
- Place the buckle in a cup of warm water and gently agitate the buckle, pressing the red button several times while it is in the water.
- Do not submerge the harness webbing and do not use soaps or lubricants, only rinse the harness buckle with warm water.
- Shake out the excess water and allow the harness buckle to air dry.

- Reattach the harness buckle into the same slot and re-check harness for correct installation according to the car seat manual before use.

Your replacement buckle will be accompanied by installation instructions. Should you have any difficulties replacing your buckle, please contact Graco by calling 1-800-345-4109 or emailing consumerservices@gracobaby.com.
