This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Kenworth Truck Company has decided that certain vehicles manufactured between August 7, 2013 and October 31, 2013 equipped with IMMI-brand L9 seat belt buckles fail to conform to the requirements of Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard (FMVSS) No. 209, "Seat Belt Assemblies". Our records indicate that your vehicle, identified by the VIN at the top of this letter, was manufactured within this time period and may contain the defect described herein.

Due to a defect in manufacturing, it may take more effort than is allowable to separate the latch plate from the seat belt buckle. This could hinder egress from the vehicle in an emergency, increasing the risk of injury

Kenworth has initiated a recall to replace the defective part. . Parts for this recall are available on a limited basis until April 18, 2014.
