

IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL

June 2014

Dear General Motors Customer:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

General Motors has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in 2013 model year Cadillac SRX vehicles equipped with a 3.6L engine e. As a result, GM is conducting a safety recall. We apologize for this inconvenience. However, we are concerned about your safety and continued satisfaction with our products.

IMPORTANT

- This notice applies to your 2013 model year Cadillac SRX equipped with a 3.6L engine, VIN _______.
- Your vehicle is involved in GM safety recall 14132.
- Schedule an appointment with your GM dealer.
- This service will be performed for you at **no charge**.

Why is your vehicle being recalled?

The transmission control module (TCM) calibration may cause a three to four second lag in acceleration if the following sequence occurs within two seconds: during an upshift from first to second gear (8-10 mph), the driver then brakes the vehicle to less than 5 mph, and then accelerates again. Under some circumstances, a three to four second lag in acceleration could result in an increased risk of a crash.

What will we do?

Your GM dealer will reprogram the TCM. This service will be performed for you at **no charge**. Because of service scheduling requirements, it is likely that your dealer will need your vehicle longer than the actual reprogramming time of approximately 30 minutes.

What should you do?

You should contact your GM dealer to arrange a service appointment as soon as possible.
