

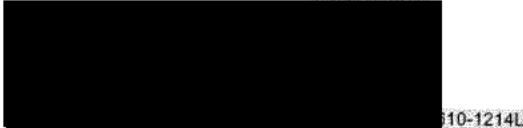

Subject: Safety Recall 1214L – Haldex Life Seal® Brake Chamber Improperly Seated

Dear Peterbilt Customer,

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Peterbilt Motors Company has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain vehicles that were manufactured between May 30, 2014 and October 24, 2014 with Haldex Life Seal® 30/30 Long Stroke Air Brake Actuators. Your vehicle has been identified as having these actuators. Haldex has informed us that the affected actuators may contain a defective air diaphragm. Specifically, the diaphragm may be improperly seated in the brake chamber, thus preventing a complete attachment to the actuation mechanism of the parking brake section of the Life Seal actuator.

The improperly seated diaphragm could allow air pressure to build internally, which may prevent full release of the actuator unit, and may induce brake drag and may result in overheated wheelend service brakes, increasing the risk of a fire.

Correction...	Replace defective brake chambers
What you must do ...	Contact your dealer immediately to schedule an appointment

Peterbilt has initiated a recall to remedy the defect free of charge. Please contact your nearest Peterbilt dealer. To find your nearest Peterbilt dealer, please visit Dealer Locator at www.Peterbilt.com. This repair should take up to 2.0 hours labor depending on axle configuration, and will be performed at no charge to you. If you had this repair performed before you received this letter, you may be eligible to receive reimbursement for the cost of obtaining a pre-notification remedy of the problem associated with this recall.
