On March 27, 2015, Takeshi IWAMI, JUS TCS Director for Jatco, Inc., verified that the transmissions and housings involved in the above-referenced recall campaign were specifically designed, manufactured and applied for the subject Nissan Armada vehicles. These transmissions and housings were not sold to any other vehicle manufacturers.

Accordingly, all product affected by the defect has been recalled and an Equipment Query investigation is not needed.

In response to the inquiry dated Mar. 20, 2015 on the recall case number 14V-803, Jatco Ltd. replies as follows;

**1. Did Jatco Inc. sell these housings/assemblies to other vehicle manufacturers?**

These transmissions and housings were specifically designed, manufactured, and applied by Jatco Ltd., Japan, only for the subject Nissan Armada vehicles, which were assembled only at the Nissan North America Inc. Canton Plant in MS and were distributed in the US market.

**2. Is Jatco, Inc. going to conduct a recall of the housings/assemblies?**


