Chronology:

In mid- January 2015, while reviewing parts specifications of the current Yaris model for the development of the future Yaris model, Toyota found that an incorrect roof headliner was specified for the involved vehicles distributed to Puerto Rico for first sale. It was then confirmed at the manufacturing plants involved that the incorrect headliner was used in vehicle production. A series of testing was performed, starting on February 12, to assess whether the incorrect headliner may have an effect on compliance with the requirements of S6.2 of FMVSS201.

As a result of this investigation, it was determined on February 27, 2015 that some vehicles do not meet the requirements of S6.2 of FMVSS201.

Description of Remedy:

Description of Remedy Program : All known owners of the subject vehicles will be notified by first class mail to

return their vehicles to a Toyota dealer for replacement of the headliner. The owner letter will instruct vehicle owners who have paid to have this condition remedied prior to this campaign to seek reimbursement pursuant
