Safety Recall Notice 14S29 / NHTSA Recall 15V-006

This notice applies to your vehicle:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the requirements of the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

The Lincoln Motor Company has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in your vehicle, with the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) shown above.

We apologize for this situation and want to assure you that, with your assistance, we will correct this condition. Our commitment, together with your dealer, is to provide you with the highest level of service and support.

What is the issue? On your vehicle, the Push-to-Start/Stop (PTS) switch is located at the bottom of the push button transmission shift control panel. The PTS switch may be inadvertently pressed while actuating nearby controls, unintentionally causing the engine to shut off. If the PTS switch is inadvertently actuated while driving, the restraint system may not perform as intended during a crash, increasing the risk of injuries.

What will Lincoln and your dealer do? The Lincoln Motor Company has authorized your dealer to replace the push button transmission shift control panel free of charge (parts and labor). The new part has the PTS switch located at the top of the push button transmission shift control panel.

How long will it take? The time needed for this repair is less than one-half day. However, due to service scheduling requirements, your dealer may need your vehicle for a longer period of time.

What should you do? Please call your dealer without delay and request a service date for Safety Recall 14S29. Provide the dealer with the VIN of your vehicle. The VIN is printed near your name at the beginning of this letter.

If you do not already have a servicing dealer, you can access www.Lincolnowner.com for dealer addresses, maps, and driving instructions.

The Lincoln Motor Company wants you to have this safety recall completed on your vehicle. The vehicle owner is responsible for making arrangements to have the work completed. The Lincoln Motor Company can deny coverage for any vehicle damage that may result from the failure to have this recall performed on a timely basis. Therefore, please have this recall performed as soon as possible.

Please note: Federal law requires that any vehicle lessor receiving this recall notice must forward a copy of this notice to the lessee within ten days.

What if you no longer own this vehicle?

If you no longer own this vehicle, and have an address for the current owner, please forward this letter to the new owner.

You received this notice because government regulations require that notification be sent to the last known owner of record. Our records are based primarily on state registration and title data, which indicate that you are the current owner.

Can we assist you further?

If you have difficulties getting your vehicle repaired promptly and without charge, please contact your dealership's Service Manager for assistance.
