4. <u>Percentage of Vehicles Estimated to Actually Experience Noncompliance:</u>

Unknown

5. <u>Description of Noncompliance</u>:

FMVSS 201 specifies certain requirements for occupant protection in interior impact. A roof headliner designated for markets outside of the U.S. was incorrectly used for vehicles to be distributed to Puerto Rico for first sale. Vehicles using this headliner may not meet some of the requirements of S6.2 of FMVSS201. This can increase the risk of an injury to occupants in the event of a crash.

6. <u>Test Results and Other Information</u>:

In mid- January 2015, while reviewing parts specifications of the current Yaris model for the development of the future Yaris model, Toyota found that an incorrect roof headliner was specified for the involved vehicles distributed to Puerto Rico for first sale. It was then confirmed at the manufacturing plants involved that the incorrect headliner was used in vehicle production. A series of testing was performed, starting on February 12, to assess whether the incorrect headliner may have an effect on compliance with the requirements of S6.2 of FMVSS201.

As a result of this investigation, it was determined on February 27, 2015 that some vehicles do not meet the requirements of S6.2 of FMVSS201.

7. <u>Description of Corrective Repair Action</u>:

All known owners of the subject vehicles will be notified by first class mail to return their vehicles to a Toyota dealer for replacement of the headliner.

Reimbursement Plan for pre-notification remedies

The owner letter will instruct vehicle owners who have paid to have this condition remedied prior to this campaign to seek reimbursement pursuant to Toyota's General Reimbursement Plan.

8. <u>Recall Schedule</u>:

Mailing of owner notifications will begin in mid-April, 2015. A draft of the owner notification letter will be submitted as soon as it is available.

9. <u>Distributor/Dealer Notification Schedule</u>:

Notification to distributors/dealers will be sent on March 5, 2015. Copies of the dealer communications will be submitted as they are issued.
