**Subject: Porsche Safety Recall AF03 – Replacement of Fuel Rail
2011 - 2012 Cayenne S Hybrid
2012 - Panamera S Hybrid**

Dear Mr.

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act.

Porsche has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in certain 2011 – 2012 model year Cayenne S Hybrid and 2012 model year Panamera S Hybrid vehicles. Our records show that you are the owner of a vehicle affected by this action.

Porsche has determined that in rare cases it is possible that under unfavorable tolerance conditions of the fuel rail and under certain dynamic driving conditions, there may be minor fuel leakage at the interface of the fuel rail and injectors. This could result in a fuel smell that may be noticeable to vehicle occupants.

While fuel leakage in the presence of an ignition source may increase the risk of fire, there have been no reports of accidents or injuries in the United States as a result of this concern.

Porsche is conducting a safety recall on these vehicles. The fuel rails in your vehicle will be replaced at no charge to you. The manufacturer, Porsche AG, is in the final phase of logistics planning and technical validation for an optimized fuel rail. Unfortunately, at this time it is impossible to predict precisely when a repair on your particular vehicle can take place. Be assured we will keep both you and your authorized Porsche dealer abreast of fuel rail availability and repair appointment scheduling.
