• On February 9, 2016, the Tier 2 supplier realigned the vibration weld fixture to bring parts back into specification.

- On February 9, 2016, the Tier 2 supplier successfully ran deployment tests to validate the tooling alignment changes.
- As of February 10, 2016, Product Related Issue #16-075-01 started, placing all vehicles at Conner Avenue Assembly Plant ("CAAP") on hold for identification and rework of suspect material.
- On February 11, 2016, the Tier 1 supplier determined affected parts were from Tier 2 supplier assemblies with weld dates of December 7, 2015, January 11, 2016, January 19, 2016 and January 29, 2016.
- On February 12, 2016, the FCA US LLC ("FCA US") Vehicle Safety and Regulatory Compliance ("VSRC") organization opened an investigation as a result of failure of a PAB Continuous Conformance Test failure on February 4, 2016.
- On October 4, 2016, FCA US determined, through the Vehicle Regulations Committee, to conduct a voluntary safety recall of the affected vehicles.
