IMPORTANT NOTICE TO DEALERS - FOR IMMEDIATE DISTRIBUTION

Volkswagen has notified the NHTSA about the upcoming safety recall described in this letter.

CODE	15F7 On or about July 01, 2016 affected vehicles will be identified in ELSA and VIN lookup with the status REPAIR NOT YET AVAILABLE.
AFFECTED VEHICLES	USA: Certain 2016 MY Volkswagen Golf, Jetta and Passat with a 1.8T engine Total population: 55 vehicles
RECALL DESCRIPTION	The fuel rail may detach from the cylinder head and result in a fuel leak. Leaking fuel in the presence of an ignition source may result in a fire.
PRECAUTIONS	If a fuel smell is detected in the vehicle, customers are advised to contact an authorized Volkswagen dealership without delay to have the vehicle inspected.
CORRECTIVE ACTION	Repair information will be provided to dealers when parts and repair instructions become available to support this recall.

IMPORTANT REMINDER ON VEHICLES AFFECTED BY SAFETY & COMPLIANCE RECALLS

New Vehicles in Dealer Inventory: It is a violation of Federal law for a dealer to deliver a new motor vehicle or any new or used item of motor vehicle equipment (including a tire) covered by this notification under a sale or lease until the defect or noncompliance is remedied. By law, dealers must correct, prior to delivery for sale or lease, any vehicle that fails to comply with an applicable Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standard or that contains a defect relating to motor vehicle safety.

Pre-Owned Vehicles in Dealer Inventory: Dealers should not deliver any pre-owned vehicles in their inventory which are involved in a safety or compliance recall until the defect has been remedied.
