## **IMPORTANT SAFETY RECALL**

### **OWNER NOTIFICATION**

### **NHTSA RECALL 16V-485**

Dear Nissan Sentra Owner:

This notice is sent to you in accordance with the National Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act. Nissan has decided that a defect which relates to motor vehicle safety exists in Model Year 2016 Nissan Sentra vehicles. Our records indicate that you own or lease the Nissan vehicle identified by the VIN on the inside of this notice.

#### **Reason for Recall**

On certain engine room harnesses, the harness terminal pin is too large to maintain a secure connection to the Engine Control Unit (ECU), resulting in poor continuity. If this condition occurs, an inadequate connection between the engine room harness terminal and the ECU may cause a no start condition, or the engine may stop while the vehicle is in motion; which may increase the risk of a crash. Air bag functionality is unaffected, even if the engine stops running.

#### **What Nissan Will Do**

Your Nissan dealer will replace the affected terminal pin in the engine room harness at no cost. The repair will take one (1) hour to complete. However, your dealer may require your vehicle for a longer period of time based upon their work schedule.

#### **What You Should Do**

Please bring this notice with you to your service appointment. Instructions have been sent to your Nissan dealer.
