Subsection 1 – A4 and A4 allroad Seat Belt Replacement (criteria FA 01, FA 02, FA 01 02, FC 01, FC 02, FC 01 02)



- Adjust the front seat and seatback all the way forward.
- Unclip the cover <1> on the belt relay <arrows> and fold it up.



- There is a risk of damaging the spring <2> if it is removed incorrectly.
- Do not to bend the spring, only move it so far until the tab on the spring can be released.
 - Release the spring catches <2> by inserting a small screwdriver in the opening in the spring in the direction of <arrow>.
 - Slide the belt end fitting <3> downward and disengage at the pin <1>.

- Move seat belt height adjuster <2> to the lowest position.
- Free up the B-pillar trim panel <1> near the door seals, disengage at the B-pillar and unclip from the bracket in the direction of <arrows A>.
- Remove the B-pillar upper trim panel from the mount on the body in the direction of <arrow B> by tilting the trim panel inward and pulling it downward at the same time.
- Remove the B-pillar trim panel with the seat belt still threaded through.

• Release the catch <1> using a screwdriver and pull the bracket <2> for the B-pillar trim panel upward out of the mounts <arrows>.







- Unclip the front and rear sill panels from the B-pillar lower trim panel.
- Free up the B-pillar lower trim panel <1> near the door seals and disengage it sideways from the B-pillar.
- Starting at the top, unclip the B-pillar trim panel from the B-pillar using the -80-200- in the direction of <arrows>.

I NOTE

The front and rear sill trim do not have to be completely removed, just unclipped from the lower B-pillar trim.

• Push the bracket together <arrows> and remove the belt guide <1> upward.

Suitable pliers may be required to push the bracket together.

• Guide out the seat belt webbing <2> and remove the seat belt guide.

- Remove the bolt <1>.
- Remove the seat belt relay <2> with the seat belt webbing.

INOTE

If vehicle has criteria open for both sides, repeat the pillar/trim removal steps for the opposite side before disconnecting the battery.





Accident risk. When working on pyrotechnic components (such as airbags and belt tensioners), the battery must be disconnected with the ignition switched **ON**.

- Turn the ignition **ON**. •
- Open the trunk/rear lid. •
- Lift the luggage compartment floor cover. •
- If equipped, remove the spare tire and vehicle • tool kit mount.
- Open the cover <3> over the battery negative • terminal.
- Loosen the nut <1>.
- Remove and isolate the battery ground cable terminal from the battery pole.

Before disconnecting the battery, it is recommended to record the customer's radio presets so they can be restored before returning vehicle to the customer.

Before handling pyrotechnic components (for example, disconnecting the connector), the person handling it must "discharge static electricity". This can be done by touching the door striker, for example.

- Disconnect connectors <2 and 5> using a • small flat bladed screwdriver to disengage connector lock <6>.
- Push the release to disconnect the seat belt tensioner control module connector <4>.

It may be necessary to remove the seat belt to access the connector lock for connector <4>.

- Remove the bolts <1 and 3> and then • remove the automatic belt retractor from the mount.
- Install the new seat belt, torque bolt <1> to 45 Nm and torque bolt <3> to 4 Nm.

Connect connectors <2, 4 and 5> and • engage the locks <6>.

I NOTE

Insert the automatic belt retractor with the anti-twist mechanism <1> in the mount in direction of <arrow> before tightening the bolt.





Install seat belt relay <2> and torque bolt <1> • to 45 Nm.

Ensure the seat belt is not twisted between the relay and the retractor.







- Guide the seat belt webbing <2> through the belt guide <1>.
- Push the bracket together <arrows> and install the belt guide <1> downward.

i TIP

Suitable pliers may be required to push the bracket together.

• Slide the bracket <2> into the mounts in the direction of <arrows> until catch <1> audibly locks.

- If needed, remove trim clips from the body using Omega Clip Tool -T40280- (or equivalent) and install into the trim panel.
- Starting at the bottom of the trim panel, install lower B-pillar trim <1> in the direction of <arrows>.
- Install front and rear sill trim into the B-pillar trim.





Before installing the upper B-pillar trim, • ensure the seat belt height adjuster is installed correctly in the guide rails.

Guide the belt webbing and seat belt latch in • through the slide for the seat belt height adjuster.

Ensure the seat belt is not twisted between the relay and the height adjuster.

- Make sure that the belt height adjuster is in • the lowest position.
- Insert the B-pillar trim panel upward into the • mount on the roof.
- When installing the upper B-pillar trim, the • retaining pin <1> for the sliding piece on the B-pillar trim panel must engage in the mount <2> on the seat belt height adjuster <arrow>.





Install the belt end fitting over the pin on the • seat frame and pull up on the belt end fitting until the lock audible engages.

Ensure the seat belt is not twisted between the Bpillar and the seat frame.

Install cover <1> if necessary. •

Ignition must be ON when connecting battery. If pyrotechnic components (e.g. airbag, belt tensioner) are not repaired correctly, they may deploy unintentionally after connecting battery. There must not be anyone inside the vehicle when connecting the battery.

- Disconnect the connector <2> from the • Battery Monitoring Control Module -J367-<3>.

- If equipped, install the vehicle tool kit and • spare tire.
- Re-install the luggage compartment floor. •
- Cycle the ignition off and back on. .
- Set clock to local time. .
- Activate the power window regulator one-. touch up/down function.
- Check the DTC memories of all the control units and erase under-voltage faults if necessary.

Subsection 2 – Q5 Seat Belt Replacement (criteria FF 01, FF 02, FF 01 02)





- Adjust the front seat and seatback all the way forward.
- Move seat belt height adjuster to the lowest position.
- Free up the B-pillar trim panel <1> near the inner door seals, disengage and unclip at the side of the B-pillar in direction of <A arrows>.
- Remove the B-pillar upper trim panel from the mount on the body in direction of <arrow B> by tilting the trim panel inward and pulling it downward at the same time.
- Remove the B-pillar trim panel with the seat belt webbing still threaded through.

- Unclip the front and rear sill panels from the B-pillar lower trim panel.
- Free up the B-pillar lower trim panel <1> near the door seals and disengage it sideways from the B-pillar.
- Starting at the top, unclip the B-pillar trim panel from the B-pillar using the -80-200- in the direction of <arrows>.

The front and rear sill trim do not have to be completely removed, just unclipped from the lower A-pillar trim.



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- Push the headrest into the lowest position.
- Move the front seat all the way forward and up.
- Remove rear bolts <3 and 4> from the seat rail.
- Move the front seat all the way to the rear in its highest position.
- Remove the front bolts <1 and 2> from the seat rail.

INOTE

Repositioning the seat allows sufficient room to remove the seat belt anchor.

- Release the retaining tab from the sill panel strip from B-pillar trim using the -T10383/1- in direction of <arrow B>.
- Unclip the sill panel from the back of the side sill using the -3409- in direction of <arrow C>.
- Open the tab <2> on the sill panel strip, guide out the strap and remove the sill panel strip.

- Release the B-pillar vent <1> at the upper clip using a small screwdriver <arrow>.
- Disconnect the connector and remove vent.





- Move seat belt height adjuster <2> to the • lowest position.
- Free up the B-pillar trim panel <1> near the door seals, disengage at the B-pillar and unclip from the bracket in direction of <arrows A>.
- Remove the B-pillar upper trim panel from the mount on the body in direction of <arrow B> by tilting the trim panel inward and pulling it downward at the same time.
- Remove the B-pillar trim panel with the seat • belt still threaded through.

- Disengage the air duct at the B-pillar and • push slightly to the side together with the seat belt webbing.
- Release the catch <1> using a screwdriver • and pull the bracket <2> for the B-pillar trim panel upward out of the mounts in direction of <arrows>.



- Free up the B-pillar lower trim panel <1> in • the area near the door seals, disengage on the side at the B-pillar and unclip from the Bpillar using the -80-200- <arrows>.
- Disconnect the speaker connector and • remove the trim panel.
- Remove the air duct (if equipped).

Open the cover <2> for the belt anchor <1> • with a screwdriver on the catches <arrow>, open and push aside.

Section C – Head Curtain Airbag (criteria 03 and 04)

U NOTE

The procedures shown for head curtain airbag replacement illustrate the driver side. Repeat the steps for removal and installation of trim panels for the passenger side.



- Pry off the cover <1> for the instrument panel side cover using the -3409- in the direction of <arrow>.
- Release the remaining retainers, pull the instrument panel cover out of the A-pillar gap cover and remove it.





• Unclip the A-pillar gap cover <1> using the -3409- <arrow A> and disengage at the A-pillar upper trim panel <arrow B>.

- Free up the A-pillar trim panel <1> in the door seal area.
- Detach the A-pillar trim panel using the -3409up to the first retainer <arrows>.





- Place a flat-head screwdriver at the position shown on the clip.
- Push the clip downward with the flat-head screwdriver into the trim panel <arrow>. This will move the clip hooks from the pin head <2>.

- Carefully remove the trim panel <1> upward out of the instrument panel in the direction of <arrow>.
- If equipped, disconnect the connector for the treble speaker.



- Pry the front roof module <3> at the clamp <2> out of the roof opening using the -3409-. In doing so, the clamp <1> is removed from the body.
- Disconnect the connectors and free up the wiring harness.



For vehicles with a front camera:

- Unclip the cover <1> using the medium-hard clip release lever (from the -VAS6845- kit) in the direction of <arrows A, B and C> by carefully inserting the clip release lever between the windshield and the cover.
- Repeat the procedure on the opposite side.
- Disengage the front of the cover <1> and remove it toward the rear.







Continued for all vehicles:

 Unclip the sun visor mount expanding cap <1> in the direction of <arrow> by sliding the -VAS6416- approximately 1 mm under the cap.

If the -VAS6416- is inserted farther, it will be located under the sun visor. It is not possible then to pry out the expanding cap.

- Disengage the sun visor <2> at the center support.
- Disengage the sun visor mount downward from the opening in the body and remove it.
- Disconnect the connector and remove the sun visor.
- Carefully pry out the vanity mirror lighting <1> at the opening <arrow> using a flat-head screwdriver.
- Disconnect the connector.

- Unclip the D-pillar trim panel <1> from the Dpillar <arrows A> using the -80-200-.
- Pull the D-pillar trim panel upward from the rear shelf <arrow B> and remove it.





- Move the front seats all the way forward.
- Unclip the child seat anchor cover <1> from the anchor in the direction of <arrow> and remove.

- Push the child seat anchor guide <1>, corresponding to cut-out, downward and disengage it from the anchor <2>.
- Remove the child seat anchor guide forward in the direction of <arrow>.





- With both hands, grasp the bench seat <1> under the seat frame <2>.
- Use both hands to firmly pull the side of the bench seat upward with a jerk in the direction of <arrow A>. This will disengage the seat frame from the front mount <3>.
- Repeat the procedure on the other side of the bench seat in the direction of <arrow B>.
- Push the side of the bench seat toward the rear. This will disengage the seat frame from the mount.
- If equipped, disconnect the seat heating connectors.
- Remove the bench seat.

- Remove the nut <1>.
- Hold the seat belt webbing aside and remove the side cushion <2> downward from the threaded pins.
- Fold the rear seat backrest forward.
- Pull the side cushion downward and remove it from the seat belt guide <arrow>.





If equipped:

- Remove the speaker trim.
- Remove the bolts <1 and 2>.

If equipped with rear sunshade:

- Fold the foldable rear seat backrest forward.
- Vehicles with sun shade: starting at the top, use the -T10383/1- to unclip the trim <1> for the sun shade guide rail <arrows>.
- Pull the lower part of the trim upward and out of the sun shade guide rail <2>; then remove it toward the inside.





Continued for all vehicles:

- Unclip the rear shelf <1> at the front using the -80-200- <arrows A>.
- Pull the rear shelf forward out of the mounts in the rear window frame <arrow B> or rear sunshade.

- Push the belt guide retaining hook <4> upward and hold it there.
- Lift the C-pillar trim panel <2> slightly and push the seat belt guide toward the rear in the direction of <arrow> until the bolt heads <3> can be disengaged from the bracket on the body.

Do not rotate the bolts <3> under any circumstances when removing and installing the seat belt guide <1>. They are set by the manufacturer.

- Remove the seat belt guide <1> sideways ٠ toward the vehicle interior.
- Equipped on some models on the right side of the vehicle: Disconnect the connector for the parking aid warning buzzer.
- Thread the seat belt webbing out and remove the seat belt guide.



- Remove the expanding clip <1> with the -T40172C- (or equivalent).
- Free up the C-pillar trim panel <2> near the door seal, disengage at the front of the C-pillar and unclip from the C-pillar using the -80-200- (or equivalent) in the direction of <arrows>.



For vehilces with a sliding sunroof:

- Open the sun shade.
- To avoid dirtying the headliner, clean the -T40233-.
- Push the -T40233- between the frame <1> for the sliding sunroof and the headliner.
- Loosen the headliner using the -T40233- from the sliding sunroof frame all the way around <arrows>, as shown.



Continued for all vehicles:

- Fold the foldable rear seat backrest back toward the rear.
- Postion the front seats so the headrests are an equal height.
- Free up the headliner in the area near the inner door seals.
- Unclip the headliner at the clips <arrows 1> from the body using the -80-200-.
- Unclip the headliner at the centering pin <arrow 2> from the body.

Use extreme care when removing the headliner from the body at clips <1> so the headliner does not bend or crease. Damage to the headliner will not be covered under this action.

- Remove both sun visor center support covers.

- When installing the upper B-pillar trim, the retaining pin <1> for the sliding piece on the B-pillar trim panel must engage in the mount <2> on the seat belt height adjuster <arrow>.



- If needed, remove trim clips from the body using Omega Clip Tool -T40280- (or equivalent) and install into the trim panel.
- Insert the A-pillar trim panel <1> in the mount on the instrument panel <arrow>.
- If equipped, connect speaker.
- Install A-pillar trim in <direction of arrows>.
- Install A-pillar gap cover.
- Install instrument panel side cover.
- Verify all seals are installed properly.
- Cycle the ignition off and back on.
- Store previously recorded radio presets (if necessary).
- Set clock to local time.
- Activate the power window regulator onetouch up/down function.
- Check the DTC memories of all the control units and erase under-voltage faults if necessary.

Section D – Passenger Frontal Airbag (criteria 05)



Accident risk. When working on pyrotechnic components (such as airbags and belt tensioners), the battery must be disconnected with the ignition switched **ON**.

- Turn the ignition **ON**.
- Move the passenger seat to the most rearward position.
- Fully recline passenger seat.

Reclining the passenger seat before disconnecting the battery allows for additional safety in the event Terminal 15 power is not restored when reconnecting the battery at the end of the repair.

- Open the trunk/rear lid.
- Lift the luggage compartment floor cover.
- If equipped, remove the spare tire and vehicle tool kit mount.
- Open the cover <3> over the battery negative terminal.
- Loosen the nut <1>.
- Remove and isolate the battery ground cable terminal from the battery pole.

Before disconnecting the battery, it is recommended to record the customer's radio presets so they can be restored before returning vehicle to the customer.

• Pry the instrument panel side cover <1> off using the -3409- <arrow> and remove it.









Before handling pyrotechnic components (for example, disconnecting the connector), the person handling it must "discharge static electricity". This can be done by touching the door striker, for example.

When removing the glovebox bolts, loosen bolt <arrow A>, but do not remove it until all remaining bolts are removed. Otherwise, the glovebox could drop and cause damage to the central wiring harness connector and knee airbag connector. Damage to wiring will not be covered under this action.

- Remove the bolts <arrows>.
- Remove glove compartment <1> just far enough until it is possible to disconnect the connector from the central connector and the knee airbag connector.
- Release the connector lock <2> with a 90° pick tool and remove the connector <1> using needle-nose pliers.
- Remove the glove compartment and the knee airbag.

- Disconnect connectors <1, 2 and 6>.
- Remove ground cable nut <7>.
- Remove and discard nuts <3> and <5>.
- Remove the passenger airbag <4>.

Set the airbag down so the airbag fabric faces upward.



Install the new airbag unit <4> using new nuts • <3 and 5> and torque to 9 Nm.

- Connect ground cable <7> and torque nut to 9 • Nm.
- Connect connectors <1, 2 and 6> and engage • connector locks.

Connect knee airbag connector <1> and • engage lock <2>.







- Connect glovebox central connector.
- Install glovebox and torque bolts <arrows> to 3 Nm.
- Install instrument panel side cover.

Ignition must be ON when connecting battery. If pyrotechnic components (e.g. airbag, belt tensioner) are not repaired correctly, they may deploy unintentionally after connecting battery. There must not be anyone inside the vehicle when connecting the battery.

- Disconnect the connector <2> from the Battery Monitoring Control Module -J367-<3>.
- Attach the battery ground cable clamp by hand to the battery negative terminal and torque the nut <1> to 6 Nm.
- Reconnect the connector to the Battery Monitoring Control Module -J367-.
- Re-install the luggage compartment floor.
- Cycle the ignition off and back on.
- Set clock to local time.
- Activate the power window regulator onetouch up/down function.
- Check the DTC memories of all the control units and erase under-voltage faults if necessary.

Properly store (retain), destroy or dispose of removed parts in accordance with all state/province and local requirements, unless otherwise indicated and/or requested through the Warranty Parts Portal (WPP).

Appendix A – Warning and Safety Precautions

General Safety Precautions when Working with Pyrotechnic Components:

- Pyrotechnic components always contain propellant that generates a gas during combustion. In some components, there is also a supply of pressurized gas to ensure this gas is generated
- This pressurized gas is stored under high pressure in a compressed gas container. Pyrotechnic components are triggered by electrical/mechanical igniters.
- Only trained personnel should perform testing, assembly and servicing work. Airbags do not have a replacement interval.
- Never check with test lamps, voltmeter or ohmmeters.
- Only check pyrotechnic components when they are installed in the vehicle using vehicle diagnosis, testing and information systems approved by the manufacturer.
- When working on pyrotechnic components and the airbag control module, disconnect the battery ground strap while the ignition is switched on. Then cover the negative terminal.
- Wait 10 seconds after disconnecting the battery.
- The ignition must be SWITCHED ON when connecting the battery. There should not be anyone inside the vehicle when doing this.
- Exception: vehicles with batteries in the passenger compartment. In this case, stay outside the range of the airbags and seat belts.
- Wash your hands after touching ignited pyrotechnic components from the restraint system.
- Do not open or repair pyrotechnic components. Use only new components to reduce the risk of injury.
- Do not install pyrotechnic components that have fallen onto a hard surface or show signs of damage.
- Discharge static electricity before handling pyrotechnic components, for example before disconnecting the electrical connector. This can be done by touching grounded metal objects such as the door striker pin.
- Install pyrotechnic components immediately after removing them from their transport packaging. If you must stop working, store the pyrotechnic component in its original transport packaging.
- Do not leave pyrotechnic components lying in the open unattended.
- Do not treat pyrotechnic components with grease, cleaning solutions or similar products.
- Do not expose pyrotechnic components to temperatures above 100 °C, even for brief periods of time.
- People in the immediate vicinity of the workplace must be protected from possible noise and projectiles.
- Pyrotechnic components can trigger unintentionally.
- In the event of deployment:
 - Single-stage inflators: allow airbag to cool down completely. Wait at least 10 minutes before handling.
- Two-stage inflators: wait for second airbag ignition. Allow airbag to cool down completely. Wait at least 10 minutes before handling.
