determined that on certain E-Class vehicles (213 platform), the roof-mounted

spoiler might not be properly attached.

air could get between the rear window and the spoiler while driving. This could ultimately lead to the spoiler detaching completely e, increasing the risk

of a crash for following traffic.

spoiler on some vehicles might not be securely attached.

## **Chronology:**

In August 2016, two cases of improperly attached roof spoilers on E-Class vehicles were reported to Mercedes-Benz USA. These complaints were considered to be isolated single failures at first but were nonetheless communicated among DAG's Vehicle Preparation Centers in the US, who are responsible for the installation of the roof spoiler for the US-market. In December 2016, the issue was reported to DAG's after-sales organization, after another failure had been reported from the field. Internal investigations and analyses were started in January 2017 to verify the root-cause of the issue. In early April 2017, DAG determined that a potential safety risk could not be excluded.
