Description of the basis for the determination of the recall population:

The recall population was determined based on manufacturing records (original equipment for 2017 model year) and service part sales records (replacement part for 2010 and 2016 model years). The VIN range reflects all possible motorcycles that could potentially experience the problem.

Description of how the vehicles being recalled differ from similar vehicles not included in the recall:

Only motorcycles potentially equipped with suspect fuel tanks (either as original equipment or replacement service part) are affected.

Defect description:

Due to an improper manufacturing process, certain fuel tanks may not have received the necessary welds around the stay bracket. Without these welds, road and engine vibrations may cause the tack weld on the stay bracket to separate, allowing for fuel leakage. Fuel leakage in the presence of an ignition source may increase the risk of a fire.

First market occurrence of a fuel leak.

October 24, 2017

Second market occurrence of a fuel leak.

November - December 2017

Honda launched a root cause investigation of the fuel leaks. Production records showed that during a single day of fuel tank production, a disruption in the manufacturing process allowed some fuel tanks to bypass the final welding stage for the stay bracket. Without final welding, the tack welds used in setting the stay bracket can separate when subjected to road and engine vibrations.

December 12, 2017

Honda made the determination that a defect related to motor vehicle safety exists and decided to conduct a safety recall.

As of December 12, 2017, Honda has received two warranty claims, and no field reports or reports of injuries or fires related to this issue.

Program for remedying the defect:

Registered owners of all affected motorcycles will be contacted by phone and mail and asked to take their motorcycle to an authorized Honda motorcycle dealer. The dealer will inspect the fuel tank welds, and if not properly welded, replace the fuel tank for free.
