Problem Description:

Ford Motor Company (Ford) is recalling certain 2018 Ford F53 stripped chassis vehicles equipped with 22.5 inch front wheels. The front wheel hub assembly may have wheel study that were not properly heat treated.

Consequence:

If a sufficient quantity of wheel studs break on one hub, vehicle handling could be affected, increasing the risk of a crash.

Remedy:

Ford will notify owners, and dealers will replace any suspect front wheel hub studs, free of charge. The recall is expected to begin August 13, 2018. Owners may contact Ford customers service at 1-866-436-7332. Ford's number for this recall is 18S21.

We note that your report states that Ford has not yet determined that wheel hubs with improperly heat treated wheel studs present an unreasonable risk to motor vehicle safety. In our view, this statement has no force or effect in terms of Ford's obligation to undertake and complete the recall and NHTSA does not agree with it. Additionally, we request a timeline of when Ford will be able to determine if a safety risk exists and expect a report of Ford's findings after Ford has made a conclusion.

Please provide a list of the 5 affected upfitters, identifying which ones fully contained the chassis and which ones may have released vehicles to end users prior to being inspected and remedied as necessary.

Please be reminded of the following requirements:

We have received Ford's proposed owner notification letter and it is currently under review. You will be notified of any changes or concerns once our review is complete.

Copies of all notices, bulletins, dealer notifications, and other communications that relate to this recall, including a copy of the final owner notification letter and any subsequent owner follow-up notification letter(s), are required to be submitted to this office no later than 5 days after they are originally sent (if they are sent to more than one manufacturer, distributor, dealer, or purchaser/owner).

Please be reminded that under 49 U.S.C. § 30112(a)(3), it is illegal for a manufacturer, to sell, offer for sale, import, or introduce or deliver into interstate commerce, a motor vehicle or item of motor vehicle equipment that contains a safety defect once the manufacturer has notified NHTSA about that safety defect. This prohibition does not apply once the motor vehicle or motor vehicle equipment has been remedied according to the manufacturer's instructions.

As stated in Part 573.7, submission of the first of six consecutive quarterly status reports is required within one month after the close of the calendar quarter in which notification to purchasers occurs. Therefore, the first quarterly report will be due on, or before, 30 days after the close of the calendar quarter.
