4/3/2019 - Peterbilt engineering asked for Safety & Compliance assistance in reviewing FMVSS 108 in reference to a model 520 show truck that was built with amber turn signals that also function as stop lights. Review of FMVSS 108 confirms that all stop lamps must be red.

4/4/2019 - 4/8/2019 - Peterbilt electrical group undertakes investigation to understand functional relationship between amber turn signals and red stop lamps.

4/10/2019-5/16/2019 - Peterbilt researched applicable regulatory requirements and relevant interpretation letters.

5/28/2019 - Peterbilt Safety Committee met.

6/3/2019 - Peterbilt Safety Committee determined that a regulatory noncompliance exists for which a recall is required.
